







NB ATHLETES MEDAL IN GRECO-ROMAN

NB FINISH WITH 3 SILVERS & BRONZE

At the conclusion of the 2016 Canadian Junior / Senior Greco-Roman Canadian Championships, four of New Brunswick's wrestling clubs could boast that they had produced a national medalist. The event, which was held Sunday, March 20, in the University of New Brunswick's South Gymnasium, wrapped up the three-day national championship weekend.

Greco-Roman, a style of wrestling that forbids holds below the waist, is practiced worldwide, and New Brunswick has experienced international success in the discipline. The competition featured 32 male athletes in both the Junior and Senior divisions.

Amongst the podium placers were Chris O'Toole (M120kg), Jeremy Poirier (M84kg), Adam Callaghan (M59kg), and Danny Boudreau (M75kg). O'Toole, of Hampton Wrestling Club, and Poirier, of Kent Wrestling Club, both scored silver medals in the Junior division, while Callaghan, of Mountaintop Wrestling Club, finished with a silver, and Boudreau, of Club de Lutte Acadie Bathurst, ended the event with a bronze in the Senior competition.

Along with New Brunswick's medalist, two other athletes competed in the Greco-Roman Championships. Both Mikeal Aube-Rousseau (M66kg) and Jesse Whalen (M74kg) wrestled in the Junior competition. Aube-Rousseau, of Club de Lutte Acadie Bathurst, placed fourth, while Whalen, of Kent Wrestling Club, ended the event in sixth.
