

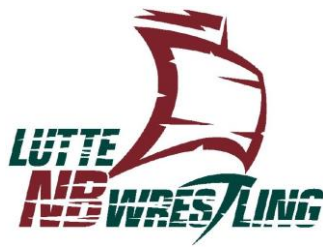


Zone Clarification

Policy 115

1. Purpose

- 1.1 This Policy outlines the geographical zones recognized by Lutte New Brunswick Wrestling (LNBW).

2. Scope of Policy

- 2.1 Policy 115 applies to all members of LNBW as defined in Article 6 of the LNBW Constitution.

3. Additional Authority

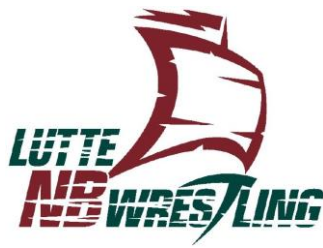
- 3.1 Bylaw 7 of the LNBW Constitution.

4. Definitions

- 4.1 Zone: Refers to any of the four (4) geographical regions of New Brunswick as established by LNBW (see Figure 1 for an illustrated map).
- 4.2 East Zone: Refers to the geographical area which encompass the communities of Moncton, Petitcodiac, Hillsborough, and Sackville, and their outlying areas which are illustrated in Figure 1.
- 4.3 West Zone: Refers to the geographical area which encompass the communities of Fredericton, Oromocto, Chipman, Minto, Boiestown, Doaktown, Stanley, Harvey, Nackawic, McAdam, Woodstock, Hartland, Florenceville, Perth-Andover, Plaster Rock, Grand Falls, and Edmundston, and their outlying areas which are illustrated in Figure 1.
- 4.5 North Zone: Refers to the geographical area which encompass the communities of Bouctouche, Rexton, Blackville, Miramichi, Bathurst, Dalhousie, and Campbellton, and their outlying areas which are illustrated in Figure 1.
- 4.6 South Zone: Refers to the geographical area which encompass the communities of St. Stephen, St. George, Grand Manan, Saint John, Rothesay, Hampton, and Sussex, and their outlying areas which are illustrated in Figure 1.

5. Recognition of Zone Representatives

- 5.1 Under Bylaw 7 of the LNBW Constitution recognizes a Zone Representative as elected officer of the Board of Directors.

- 5.2 A Zone Representative shall be elected by each of the LNBW geographic zones with Association members.
 - 5.3 If a zone fails to have Association members reside within the boundary then the position of Zone Representative shall remain vacant.

6. Criteria of Zone Representative

- 6.1 Bylaw 7 of the LNBW Constitution states that each Zone Representative shall be elected at specially held zone meetings by the Privileged Members Group of that zone, which every privilege member group in each respective zone receiving proper notification of said meeting.
- 6.2 In order to hold the office a Zone Representative the individual must be a member in good standing with LNBW, and reside within the zone that he/she represents.

7. Recognition of Zones

- 7.1 LNBW recognizes the geographic zones established by the Government of New Brunswick's Anglophone School Districts, and active as of January 19, 2015 (boundaries are illustrated in Figure 1).
- 7.2 LNBW's Board of Executive reserves the right to maintain these boundaries regardless of changes passed by Government of New Brunswick's Anglophone School Districts.

8. Conflict Resolution

- 8.1 In the event of a dispute over the geographical location of a privilege member, or an individual member's dwelling, LNBW's Board of Executive reserves the right to past judgment.
