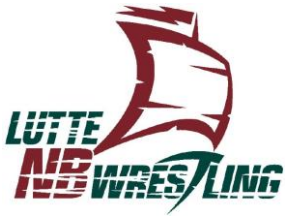

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# LUTTE NEW BRUNSWICK WRESTLING

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## 1. Purpose

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- 1.1 This document outlines the criteria that will be used by Lutte New Brunswick Wrestling (LNBW) to select athletes for the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie, as well as any other domestic or international training/competitive opportunities that will be part of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team program.

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## 2. Language

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- 2.1 Where there is a difference in interpretation between the French and English version of this document, then the English version shall prevail.

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## 3. Modification of the Document/Unforeseen Circumstances

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- 3.1 In the event of unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of LNBW, that prevents the fair implementation of these selection procedures as written, the High Performance Committee (HPC) reserves the right to determine an appropriate course of action, which may include the right to review and change any part of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team selection procedures in the case of a rule or policy change from United World Wrestling, Wrestling Canada, or Jeux de la Francophonie.

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## 4. Scope of Policy

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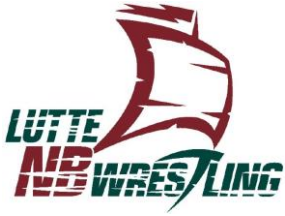
- 4.1 Policy 116 applies to all members of LNBW as defined in Article 6 of the LNBW Constitution.

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## 5. Decision Making Authority

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- 5.1 The Jeux de la Francophonie coaches, in conjunction with the Executive Director (ED), are responsible for the development and implementation of these selection procedures. All team nominations will be ratified by the HPC. The ED is responsible for ensuring that the process outlined in this document is properly followed and that the selection process is fair and equitable for all candidates.



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## 6. Nomination Procedures

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- 6.1 All athlete nominations for the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team must be submitted in writing to the LNBW Office to be considered. Submissions must:
- Be on club letter head,
  - Include a supporting statement as to why of why the athlete should be considered for the program,
  - Contain the signature of the LNBW Coach who is submitting the nomination.
- 6.2 Nominated athletes will be evaluated based on the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team Selection Criteria found in 8. by the HPC.
- 6.3 Athletes with the highest total of accumulated points will be considered for 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team.
- 6.4 All athlete nominations, including alternates, will be ratified by the HPC.

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## 7. Athlete Eligibility

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- 7.1 In order to be eligible to be considered for selection to the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team, all athletes must meet the following requirements at the time of selection and maintain these requirements throughout the course of the program:
- Be a Canadian citizen;
  - Hold a valid Canadian passport that does not expire within 6 months of the return date from the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie;
  - Be in compliance with all relevant United World Wrestling, Wrestling Canada, and Jeux de la Francophonie requirements for eligibility;
  - Sign and submit the LNBW Athlete Agreement Form no later than April 6th, 2015;
  - Be a member in good standing of LNBW.

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## 9. Definitions

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### 9.1 Commitment to a YTP

A Yearly Training Plan (YTP) is a document developed by the athlete's coaching staff. The YTP should demonstrate the intended Physiological, Psychological, and Technical training for the designated year. The YTP should include the following:

- Assessment of the Athlete
- General goals and objectives for the program
- Identify the Events of Program
- Determine the type of Periodization used in program
- Determine the duration of the Competition Period(s)
- Determine the duration of the Transition period(s)
- Determine the duration of the Preparation period(s)
- Determine the Phases of each Period of program
- Determine the importance of key performance factors throughout the plan
- Determine the expected progression of the workload throughout the plan

The YTP must also include an evaluation phase to determine the success of the athlete's training program.

Each year an YTP must be submitted per athlete to the LNBW office to be reviewed and agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

#### **Point Evaluation:**

The YTP will be evaluated on a pass or fail basis. If the YTP is submitted every year, and if the athlete has satisfied their commitment to the plans, then the athlete will be awarded five (5) points.

If the YTP is not submitted, or the athlete is deemed not to have followed the prescribe training, then the athlete will not be awarded any point towards their evaluation.



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## 9.2 Supervised Strength and Conditioning Program

A Supervised Strength and Conditioning Program is any program recognized by LNBW as a prescribed fitness regime which is supervised by a certified strength and conditioning professional.

Coaches must submit their athlete's supervised strength and conditioning program each year, along with their YTP, to the LNBW office to be reviewed and agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

### **Point Evaluation:**

The Supervised Strength and Conditioning Program will be evaluated on a pass or fail basis. If the Supervised Strength and Conditioning Program are submitted every year, and the athlete has satisfied their commitment to the programs, then the athlete will be awarded five (5) points.

If the Supervised Strength and Conditioning Program is not submitted, or the athlete is deemed not to have followed the prescribe training, then the athlete will not be awarded any point towards their evaluation.

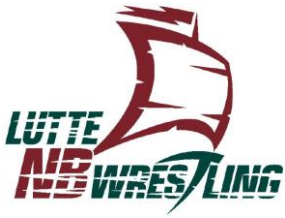

## 9.7 Canadian Olympic Team Trials (2016)

Athletes will be evaluated on a sliding scale based on their performance at the 2016 Canadian Olympic Team Trials.

### **Point Evaluation:**

Athletes who progress past the Qualifying Tournament to the ladder matches of the 2016 Canadian Olympic Team Trials will be evaluated as follows:

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All other athletes who attend the Qualifying Tournament will be awarded three (3) points towards their evaluation.

## 9.8 International Success (2014)

An athlete will be evaluated on their performances at international events for the year of 2014. International events are any tournament or high performance training camp in which the athlete is a member of a Canadian National Wrestling Team. An event that falls outside of this scope may be deemed appropriate, and used for evaluation, if agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

### **Point Evaluation:**

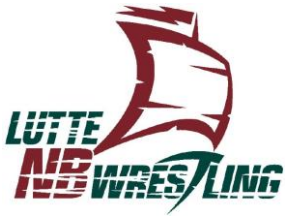
For attending an approved international event in 2014, the athlete will receive five (5) points. Earning a medal at an approved international event will garner an athlete ten (10) points. Athletes can only earn a maximum of 10 points for deemed international success in 2014. Approved training camps can only earn the participant five (5) points.

## 9.9 International Success (2015)

An athlete will be evaluated on their performances at international events for the year of 2015. International events are any tournament or high performance training camp in which the athlete is a member of a Canadian National Wrestling Team. An event that falls outside of this scope may be deemed appropriate, and used for evaluation, if agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

### **Point Evaluation:**

For attending an approved international event in 2015, the athlete will receive five (5) points. Earning a medal at an approved international event will garner an athlete ten (10) points. Athletes can only earn a maximum of 10 points for deemed international success in 2015. Approved training camps can only earn the participant five (5) points.



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## 9.10 International Success (2016)

An athlete will be evaluated on their performances at international events for the year of 2016. International events are any tournament or high performance training camp in which the athlete is a member of a Canadian National Wrestling Team. An event that falls outside of this scope may be deemed appropriate, and used for evaluation, if agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

### Point Evaluation:

For attending an approved international event in 2016, the athlete will receive five (5) points. Earning a medal at an approved international event will garner an athlete ten (10) points. Athletes can only earn a maximum of 10 points for deemed international success in 2016. Approved training camps can only earn the participant five (5) points.

## 9.11 International Success (2017)

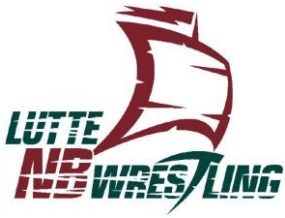
An athlete will be evaluated on their performances at international events for the year of 2017. International events are any tournament or high performance training camp in which the athlete is a member of a Canadian National Wrestling Team. An event that falls outside of this scope may be deemed appropriate, and used for evaluation, if agreed upon by all stakeholders of the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team New Brunswick.

### Point Evaluation:

For attending an approved international event in 2017, the athlete will receive five (5) points. Earning a medal at an approved international event will garner an athlete ten (10) points. Athletes can only earn a maximum of 10 points for deemed international success in 2017. Approved training camps can only earn the participant five (5) points.

## 9.12 University Nationals (2015-2017)

An athlete will be evaluated on their performances at the Canadian Inter-university Sport (CIS) Wrestling Championships for the span of 2015 to 2017. Athletes will be evaluated on a sliding scale based on their best performance among the three years.

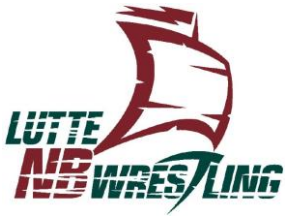

## 9.16 Canadian Sports Center Atlantic Targeted Athlete (2015-2017)

Athletes who are eligible to receive Canadian Sport Centre Atlantic (CSCA) services must be identified under one of the following three headings:

- Podium: Podium Canada targeted athletes
- Canadian Elite: National team and national development team carded athletes
- Canadian Development: Non-carded national team members

### **Point Evaluation:**

An athlete will be awarded five (5) points for each year that the individual is identified by CSCA between 2015 and 2017. For example: 2015 = 5, 2016 = 5, and 2017 = 5. If an athlete is not recognized by CSCA for any of the listed years then the athlete will be awarded zero (0) points for the evaluated year.

## 9.17 Represent NB at Senior / Junior Canadian Championships (2015-2017)

An athlete who attends a Senior or Junior Canadian Championships between 2015 to 2017, as a member of a wrestling club which is a member in good standing of LNBW, will be deemed to have represented the province of New Brunswick.

### **Point Evaluation:**

Athletes will be assessed on a pass or fail basis. An athlete will be awarded five (5) points for each year that the individual attends a Senior or Junior Canadian Championships between 2015 to 2017. For example: 2015 = 5, 2016 = 5, and 2017 = 5. If an athlete fails to attend the Senior or Junior Canadian Championships during any of the listed years then the athlete will be awarded zero (0) points for the evaluated year.



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## 9.18 Results at the Junior Canadian Championships (2014)

Athletes will be evaluated on a sliding scale based on their performance at the 2014 Junior Canadian Championships.

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## 10. Individual Programs for Selected Team Members

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10.1 Selected team members will be required to demonstrate a commitment to an approved training and competition program. Approved training camps and scheduled competitions are a necessary part of an athlete's preparation program and are, therefore, mandatory. Both athletes and personal coaches must be in constant communication with the 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Coaching Staff, and ED, in order to collaborate on best practices and ensure optimal preparation for the benchmark event. In addition to programs identified, the personal coach and 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Coaching Staff will identify specific competitive and training program requirements for each 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team member. These requirements will be based upon the athletes' individual needs.

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## 11. Appeal Procedures

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11.1 The 2017 Jeux de la Francophonie Team selection may be appealed in accordance with the procedures set out in Policy 105 - LNBW Appeals Policy.
